President's Column

Last *Blue Notes* issue, my President's Message was on how I often manage to get great seats at blues (and other) shows I attend. As you may know, my cousin Barbara calls me "The Ticket Whisperer'! I also stated in the last issue that I



would address concert etiquette in this issue. Several events I have recently attended, and even *Rolling Stone* Magazine and Emily Post, have addressed the need of late for a few concert rules, so I have put together the ones that I, several friends and some Board members have come up with and think are important:

- 1. Do not invade the personal space of other concert attendees.
- 2. Limit conversations with others not sitting with you to a minimum, or take it elsewhere.
- 3. Do not check your email, fb or twitter accounts every couple of minutes. Your cell phone emits a harsh distracting glow. You should have dimmed it.
- 4. Do not stand up at your seat at venues with reserved seats. Please stay seated, except for ovations or encores and excitement that gets you up, for just a few moments. This particularly applies to those with seats in the front. You already have the best seats and nobody behind you can see if you are standing.
- 5. Most importantly, be mindful, respectful, and attentive to the artist and other concert goers and you will have an exciting time!
- 6. Do not record the entire show, take pictures, or text the whole time, it can be irritating to those sitting next to you. (Take it elsewhere).
- 7. I've noticed that blues lovers are generally good about alcohol at events but try not to overdo it and get sloppy, spill drinks, stumble into people. (It is rude and unwelcome!). And if the venue has a dance floor, do NOT bring your drink onto the dance floor while

you're dancing. Find a spot to put it down before getting out there!

- 8. I cannot imagine this happening at a blues show, but the newest thing is throwing things on stage. Please, how rude!
- 9. Please, do not vell out "Free Bird" ever!


The Sofia is a great venue right here in River City! Perhaps the more we support it, the more choices they'll be able to offer?

He is the 2023 Blues Music Award Winner – "Best Soul Blues Album of the Year" for *In Too Deep* (FortyBelow Records). Sugaray was also nominated for "Vocalist of the Year" and "B.B. King Entertainer of the Year."

At 6' 5" and 300 pounds, this North Texas-born soul/blues entertainer is making his long-awaited return to Sacramento to help us close out the year with songs from his award-winning record. Rayford is known worldwide for his joy and spontaneity on stage. He is equally known for his truth and fearlessness in advocacy storytelling. A deeply important background in gospel choirs as a child near Tyler, Texas gave him a footing to face poverty and personal loss. His choice to become a Marine, and then become a soul blues singer and songwriter after he served is all there, embedded in his lyrics and cathartic performances. When you witness "Please Take My Hand," (https://youtu.be/vuQvN78_sQQ?si=vcCfxJH1tTJwrp8x) it's his whole story, micro and macro.

The mighty Hammond B-3 and a steppin' horn section means a deep dive throwback into old school party to many of us, but to a younger audience, it's an epiphany. That's what he brings. "You'll be up and dancing to the soulful music," says Rayford, "then you'll start to realize that the song is serious with a fine dance beat." Party Message Music!

"Sugaray Rayford's the total package — brilliant songwriting, energetic performances, inimitable vocals — and In Too Deep reveals every facet of his marvelous gifts to us." No Depression

In Sugaray's own words: "I want all of my albums to be something that I will always be proud of. Life may knock me down, and I might get discouraged, but I will never give up hope. While many of the songs are deep on the new one, we wanted to have some that shared love, because that is at the core of my being. We have given people the truth, we have laid out the vinegar, now we need to lift their spirits.

"It is like the old Black church I grew up in. The preacher hits you with hell and brimstone but leaves you with life is beautiful. The Holy Ghost is moving, the people are shouting, and you had a good time in church. But you also got knowledge. I approached this whole album like I was giving a sermon. I want people who purchase and listen to the album to feel the positivity of love and understanding. That is my core being, and that is never going to change."



On August 24th, 2023, the Sacramento Blues Society hosted Bernard Allison and his band at Harlow's nightclub in Sacramento. The blues virtuoso delivered an electrifying performance that showcased his exceptional guitar skills, soulful vocals, and groovy

A Casual Conversation with Sugaray Rayford By Barbara Katen

To say the Sacramento Blues Society loves the amazing Sugaray Rayford and his band would be an understatement. A HUGE hit at our Holiday Membership Gala in 2018, we received numerous requests to try and bring him back for our Gala this year. AND WE



DID IT (thank you, thank you Mindy Giles!). Sugaray and his merry band will be the entertainment at our Annual Holiday Membership Gala on December 3, 2023 at Harlow's!

Since appearing at our Gala in 2018, Sugaray has gone on to be nominated for a Grammy in 2020 in the Best Contemporary Blues Album category for his 2019 album, *Somebody Save Me*. Also in 2018, Sugaray was nominated for four Blues Music Awards (Soul Blues Album, Soul Blues Male Artist, Instrumentalist – Vocals, and B.B. King Entertainer of the Year) for the 39th annual Blues Music Awards. In 2020, Sugaray was presented with two Blues Music Awards for 'B.B. King Entertainer of the Year' and 'Soul Blues Male Artist of the Year'. His latest album, *In Too Deep*, was released in 2022 and was cited as 'Soul Blues Album of the Year' at the 2023 Blues Music Awards.

I think Sugaray has a fondness for the Sacramento Blues Society, and this fondness is reciprocated ten-fold! Not only an amazing talent, he's a terrific human being. I reached out to do this interview

Casual Conversation w. Sugaray Rayford, Con't. from P. 8 and he responded with an affirmative right away. He's the real deal.

Blue Notes (BN): What was your inspiration to start singing?

Sugaray Rayford (SR): My motivation to start singing, seeing my mother singing.

BN: What role did music play in the early years?

SR: It was crucial because between that and basketball, it kept me out of trouble.

BN: When and how did you get your start in music?

SR: I got started on music to breakdancing, and the church loved every minute of it.

BN: If you hadn't become a musician/singer, what do you think you would be doing right now?

SR: Minister of Music!

BN: Who have been your biggest musical influences?

SR: Ricky Warren, my mother, Shirley Caesar.

BN: Do you have a favorite song to perform and why?

SR: My favorite song to perform, and I haven't done it in a while "Just Can't Hide Love" by Earth Wind & Fire, and "Wonderful World" by Louis Armstrong.

BN: Is there anything special you do to prepare your voice before performing?

SR: I do like to do warm-ups and try to drink as much water as I can. The rest is a secret!

BN: With what musician would you most like to collaborate?

SR: I would have loved to be able to play with the group Loose Ends.

BN: What are you most excited about in your life right now?

SR: What I am most excited about in life right now is the anticipation of what tomorrow brings.

BN: What has been the highlight of your career so far?

SR: People with no civility.





CD Review

The Nick Moss Band Featuring Dennis **Gruenling - Get Your Back Into It**

Alligator Records

After establishing their bona fides with legends like Jimmy Dawkins, Jimmy Rogers, Kim Wilson and Rick Estrin guitarist Nick Moss and harmonica player Dennis Gruenling joined forces in 2018 on Alligator Records. This is their 3rd release with a very tight quintet and what a joy!



With a vintage combo sound that evoked Little Walter and the Aces at times and William Clarke at others, the NMB gives us 11 varied vocals and 3 instrumentals, all originals in keeping with Bruce Iglauer's imprint's ethos. On fast numbers, Moss's voice reminded me of John Hammond, Jr., and his guitar work is compelling throughout. Gruenling's voice is not my taste but his harp solos and fills are delightful. The rhythm section of Taylor Streiff, Rodrigo Mantovani and Pierce Downer merit accolades, too.

The set kicks off with "The Bait in the Snare" which grabs you right off- these guys can really lay it down! I particularly liked the alternation of fast grooves like "Man on the Move" and "Your Bark is Worse Than Your Bite" with bluesy ballads "Living in Heartache", "Choose Wisely" and "Lonely Fool." The instrumentals are great romps that allow the band to demonstrate its chops and the shout out to Jimmy Johnson "The Solution", wonderfully encapsulates his mournful

wisdom.

If ever there is doubt that the torch of the blues tradition has been extinguished, Nick Moss, Dennis Gruenling and their band mates put that to rest on this album. Chicago is still loaded with the blues.

"Mick Martin's Blues Party," Radio Show Is Back Home at K-ZAP! By Mindy Giles

Mick Martin, smiling like the original KZAP Cheshire cat, is back happily presenting the "Blues Party" at the station where it all started.

When the news broke on Wednesday, August 30 that numerous long-running, locally-produced and hosted music programs on Capitol Public Radio were being axed, and that the "Blues Party" was one, the reaction from Martin's large contingency of listeners was swift. Fans went into action, calling, writing, railing at the station, ceasing their financial support.

And then, one more person stepped up. Dennis Newhall, the man who led the 2015 team that phoenix-like, revived the legendary KZAP after 23 years off the air, was there with the solution. In 2020, when COVID hit, the "Blues Party" went from being live-in-the-studio to pre-produced. Newhall had become Martin's engineer and

collaborator at CapRadio, and so was already hands on with production.

"We've been friends since high school and share a passion for music," says Martin. "When the show was canceled by CapRadio, Dennis' K-ZAP (93.3FM and streaming worldwide at www.k-zap.org) was the perfect choice for its new home." Mick and his "Blues Party" went back on the air on Saturday, Sept. 9!

And thus the serendipity, back where it all began. "In 1989, I had been doing



movie reviews during drive time when KZAP asked me to do a blues show," Martin says, "I jumped at the chance. I've loved the blues for as long as I can remember. They say you don't choose the music you love: it chooses you."

Music fan/tech man Frank Farmer has remained with these two old friends, researching, compiling the music files of Mick's imagination. Martin adds, "We three musketeers are still having a ball keeping the blues alive."

CD Review Joel Astley - Seattle to Greaseland

CD showcases Joel's ability to write, sing, and play. Witty, creative, and occasionally sly, Joel's lyrics have nearly universal appeal. From warm and lighthearted to slow and sweet – or bouncy and sweet, as is the case with the tune "Candy Shop" – the album has something for everyone. While the tunes are all original, they have the flavor and flair of classic blues tunes while still being fresh and new, and it isn't hard to imagine other artists covering these tunes in the future. Yes, they are that good.

With this album, the multi-award-winning lyricist, vocalist, and harmonica player takes us on a musical sojourn from heaven to hell and back again, lyrically speaking. From the first track, "Born Cryin", which explores and elucidates the deep roots of the blues, we travel with Joel across the breadth of blues music styles. Astley's versatility shines throughout.

Since the album's release, the storytelling saga "Secondhand Kid," has been getting considerable airplay, and deservedly so. But all the songs on the album are worthy of a listen. "Karma Wheel" is the perfect song for your commute, for the times when getting back at that driver who just cut you off in traffic is just about all you can think about. The firmly tongue-in-cheek "Takin' It with Me," which tells the tale of a man who doesn't plan on leaving it all behind, is my personal favorite. "Hot As Hell," which takes the figurative description of the girl that every guy wants to meet and makes it literal, is followed by the semi-educational "Work with What You Got." "Bobby's Place" imagines for us the kind of place that we all wish for in our own neck of the woods. The CD concludes with the beautifully rich gospel sound of "No Brighter Gold."

Along with Joel's excellent harp work, the album prominently features the guitar stylings of Rockin' Johnny Burgin, with Kid Andersen joining in variously on guitar, keyboards, and backing vocals according to the needs of each tune. The rhythm portion on the album consists of the silky-smooth bass playing of Randy Bermudes and June Core's crisp attack on the skins. Together, these two are known for making up the backing section for Charlie Musselwhite's

touring band, and they definitely do not disappoint. The album's sound is rounded out with tastefully done backing vocals by Jill Dineen and Marina Crouse.


A truly splendid show once again from our own talented musicians stepping up to join in the fun with the remarkable Johnny Burgin!

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


